********************************** WHAT WILL KINGSWAY DO NOW THAT AUGUSTA IS CLOSING?


 \bigstar ★ The short answer is, the same thing that we have always done! The closing of Augusta Correctional Center does not end Kingsway's ministry and our need for support; if anything, it increases our need. Looking back at the last year, here \bigstar are a few of the numbers to help you better understand what all Kingsway does: \bigstar

- Correspondence Bible Study: We provide correspondence Bible studies to 62 inmates in 17 prisons & 2 jails.
- \bigstar ☆ • Encourager Program: We have 27 volunteers corresponding to 62 inmates in the state of Virginia.
- Apple Tree Project: We gave gifts to over 179 children whose parents are incarcerated with assistance from 34 \bigstar churches and other organizations.
- ☆. Christmas Gifts for Inmates: We gave toothpaste, notepads, lip balm, and Christmas cards to approximately 6000 \bigstar inmates in 10 prisons and 2 jails.
- ☆• We send Valentine's Day, Easter, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Birthday cards to approximately 1,800 inmates each \bigstar year in **43** prisons in the state of Virginia and **2** regional jails.
- Kingsway currently facilitates inside church services at Augusta Correctional Center and Coffeewood Correctional $\star \bullet$ **Center**. We're working to set up services at prisons further away now that Augusta is closing. \bigstar
- Kingsway assisted **86** returning citizens with getting into sober living homes. ☆ •
- Kingsway provided 59 individuals with hygiene kits upon release. ☆ •
 - Kingsway gave **70** cell phones so returning citizens can be in contact with employers, landlords and parole officers.
- \bigstar Kingsway referred **63** people to community partners for assistance. \bigstar

With approximately 190 inmates whom Kingsway is connected to being released in 2024, the requests for Kingsway's assistance are only increasing!

Kingsway does much more, but these are the highlights!



To Louise Jennings & The Kingsway Family,

Greetings of love and peace in the authority of our Lord.

On August 3, 2023, I was transferred from Augusta Correctional Center to Deerfield. Without even trying, my mind automatically compares my ten years' worth of experiences at Augusta to Deerfield. Augusta presented its own share of challenges because it is prison. However, the culture was saturated with the ministry of Kingsway. While there I had the privilege of serving as a Chaplain's clerk under two different Chaplains. I observed first-hand how both Chaplains worked hand in hand with Louise coordinating services and special events for the sole purpose of blessing the men at Augusta. Being there so long, I witnessed the testimonies of men from other faith groups sharing amongst themselves about the blessing Kingsway has been to the church body, wishing they had a faithful guardian angel of their own.

It is no secret that Kingsway has been there as a staple from the beginning, running deep into the soil of that institution. From warden to warden down through the years, Shel and Louise found favor in the eyes of God and these men. Greeting cards, Bible studies, religious books, toothpaste, ChapStick, gloves, and socks are but a few of the notable ways Kingsway has consistently blessed all the residents of ACC down through the years. And the men of all colors, religious affiliations, and socio-economic backgrounds came to look forward to your blessings motivated purely by your love for God.

Every Friday night like clockwork, the volunteers from Kingsway's inside ministry would be waiting to greet us whereever the facility provided for us to meet on that particular evening. Men and women with smiling faces and glowing hearts greeted us upon entry ready to shake a hand, uplifting spirits and offering encouragement. For a lot of the men Friday night was not just a church service but a special visit from family. After awhile I began to refer to the volunteers as "The Purple People" and would introduce them as such when I opened the services. Louise embraced the title with the accent of purple hair to match her purple attire. I personally enjoyed the peaceful presence of Jim McManus. He came but didn't object if time didn't permit him to share on a given night. There was also Richard Jackson and his lovely wife. I remember the day I saw her out of the wheelchair lost in worship basking in the glory of God. I love you both! My dear adopted family Don and Carleen. Their given last name is Loveless but I declared that couldn't be right because they are full of love. He was Uncle Don and she was Aunt Carleen. He would strum the guitar and sing praises to God totally dependent upon Carleen's finger to point out his place on the page. The sound men would do their very best to capture his baritone vocals via microphone so all could enjoy his gift, while Carleen on the other hand needed no microphone as her vocals rang out head and shoulders above everyone else harmonizing with her husband. I really miss her fiery passionate sermons that were so honest as she incorporated so much of her life and testimony in every one of them. Sandy and Pappy were the quiet bunch. When given the opportunity, Sandy would give her best impersonation of Louise in her absence. She was always willing to read a poem just like Louise would do at every service. Harvey Senger was a recent addition to the family but he was right on time. His sermons were right down there on the level where the men could receive them. His passion and zeal for God shined bright in every word. Thank you for you heart of service and desire to break free from the status quo of religion in favor of a real relationship with our Heavenly Father. And then there was Louise: the tambourine shaking, "everyone needs to sign in on her sheet," powerhouse of a presence woman. It was easy to see why people called her Momma Louise. Louise is royalty. Her legacy will continue to ring in institutions around the state. There simply is no comparison to the impact Kingsway has made in the lives of the men who have been graced with your ministry. The Apple Tree program is just one example of the loving blanket stretched far and wide over every family affected by incarceration. There are too many testimonies to count, but it is nothing compared to the hours spent behind the scenes with paperwork, shopping, and wrapping gifts. Thank you to every faceless, nameless person who gave of your time and resources to the Kingsway super engine.

As the Chaplain's Clerk, part of my responsibility was to facilitate the services. I also led the praise and worship portion of the service. I recognize the differences in worship styles and readily admit that my style is not the most popular. However, when the Kingsway volunteers came they always gave me license to worship freely. Not only that, I witnessed first-hand eyes closed, hands uplifted, and tear-streaked faces of the Kingsway volunteers in intimate worship. In the throne room, inmates and volunteers became sons and daughters of our Heavenly Father. You never rushed me as I endeavored to lead us into His presence. You never questioned me on my stance of not preparing a song list beforehand. I went in totally relying on the Holy Spirit to manifest His presence and will for the service, and He never disappointed us. In His presence He is able to touch us all by Himself in ways that our most prolific dissertation could never. My total reliance on Him became the staple and we experienced growth in the body: not only in numbers, but also in character and integrity, and in lifestyle and zeal for the things of God. I couldn't have done it without your assistance. Thank you.

Please receive these flowers of love and appreciation presented with thankfulness for your many years of service and for how my life was personally impacted.

One 9/30/23 Brother Alvin Yoder gave a wonderful testimony as to the work your outreach is accomplishing there in Harrisonburg I was encouraged by the Lord to sent this donating. I do not need anything for tax purposes or receipt. Kingsway was instrumental in the start of-Rehoboht Jail and prison ministry 37 years ago. So you all are in out prayers and we are thankful for Brothers like brother Alvin carrying on the work of the Lord.

The Revelation of the Kingdom and Glory of the Savior

This crucial component of Scripture brings the whole story to its God-ordained consummation. Redemptive history is controlled by God, so as to culminate in His eternal glory. Redemptive history will end with the same precision and exactness with which it began. The truths of eschatology are neither vague nor unclear—neither are they unimportant. As in any book, how the story ends is the most crucial and compelling part—so with the Bible. Scripture notes several specific features of the end planned by God.

In the Old Testament, there is repeated mention of an earthly kingdom ruled by the Messiah, Lord Savior, who will come to reign. Associated with that kingdom will be the salvation of Israel, the salvation of the Gentiles, the renewal of the earth from the effects of the curse, and the bodily resurrection of God's people who have died. Finally, the Old Testament predicts that there will be the "uncreation" or dissolution of the universe, and the creation of a new heaven and a new earth (which will be the eternal state of the godly) and a final hell for the ungodly.

In the New Testament, these features are clarified and expanded. The King was rejected and executed, but He promised to come back in glory, bringing judgment, resurrection, and His kingdom for all who believe. Innumerable Gentiles from every nation will be included among the redeemed. Israel will be saved, grafted back into the root of blessing from which she has been temporarily excised.

Israel's promised kingdom will be enjoyed, with the Lord Savior reigning on the throne, in the renewed earth, exercising power over the whole world, having taken back His rightful authority and receiving due honor and worship. Following that kingdom will come the dissolution of the renewed, but still sin-stained creation, and the subsequent creation of a new heaven and new earth, which will be the eternal state, separate forever from the ungodly in hell. Louise's Corner

Well, I got through my first month of retirement, but not the way I wanted it. I was able to go inside Augusta Correctional Center for the regular Friday night service, but even that was different because the DOC is closing Augusta the last of June and are moving the men we have known for years. In January 2023 there were over 1400 men and our services were around 80 men; in January 2024 they were down to about 500. It is sad because some of these men have been in Augusta for over 30 years and now, they have to go to yet another prison. In trying to decide what was best for Kingsway and my retirement, I couldn't decide if I needed to stay away or just come in and start plowing through all the boxes of memories I shared about last time, but COVID decided that for me and I spent 10 days sick with COVID. Thank goodness I am over that now. I have an Intern coming in to help me write the book I have been wanting to get done. Just before I got sick, I was invited to do a podcast with pastor Margaret and Grayson at First Church of the Nazarene Voice of Hope. That podcast aired on WBTX on February 11, 2024. The recording of my testimony is now on Kingsway's website under Videos, and is also on Kingsway's Facebook page if you would like to hear it. Pray for me as I continue to volunteer and do what I feel God still has for me to do and that I don't get in the way of progress. Paula Ford is our new Director and is doing a great job.
